SHARING AND TEAMWORK

Encourage your baby and toddler to share their blocks. By encouraging these interactions, you're fostering a budding understanding of teamwork.

MOTOR SKILLS

The simple act of holding blocks improves hand-eye coordination and strengthens little fingers and hands. This is great practice for gripping other objects, too!



Infants, toddlers and kids learn to think logically when playing with building blocks. After some trial and error, they'll learn that blocks need to be arranged in a specific way to build taller structures. Best of all? When you build something tall, it's even more fun to knock over!

Introduce the concept of taking turns by placing one piece at a time to build any of the project examples shown.

CREATE

1:2 The width of one plank is exactly two plank thicknesses.




1:5 The length of one KEVA Junior plank equals exactly five widths.






Build a road for your vehicles, tracks for a train or a maze for your stuffed animals or bristlebots!




Mirror, Mirror

Work together to make a symmetrical design. Create a line with a piece of removable tape, string or a line drawn on a piece of paper. Take turns placing KEVA Junior Planks, so that the design is always the same on each side of the line. Take turns being the leader or the follower.

Create repeating patterns.







Build simple shapes like squares, triangles, diamonds, rectangles and more.











ABC - 123

Use your KEVA planks to construct each letter of the alphabet and the numbers O-9. This is a great way to start recognizing letters, numbers and how they're constructed. Bonus idea: Practice making each letter of your child's name and make sure to count each plank as you go along.
