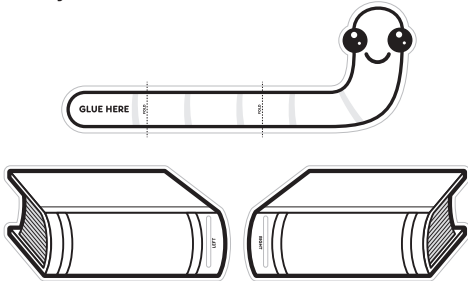


# 13831926 BUILD A BOARD SIMPLE VS. COMPOUND BULLETIN BOARD

Assess your students' knowledge and display their work with this Simple vs. Compound Sentence activity!

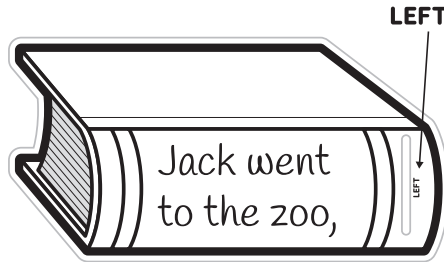
## Step 1:

Provide each student a worm, a book labeled "left," and a book labeled "right." Students are to find two simple sentences that could be combined with a conjunction.



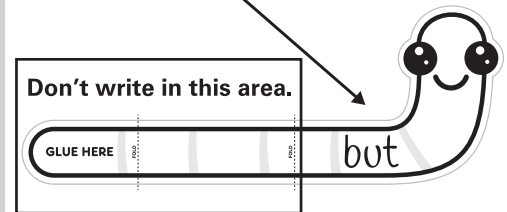
## Step 2:

Next, have students create their compound sentence by writing the first simple sentence on the book labeled "left," making sure to use the correct capitalization and punctuation. (The sentence should be written to the left of the slit.)



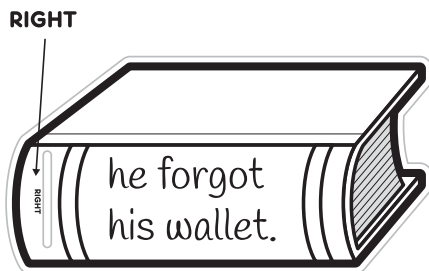
## Step 3:

Choose the conjunction that works best and write it on the worm in the section near his head.



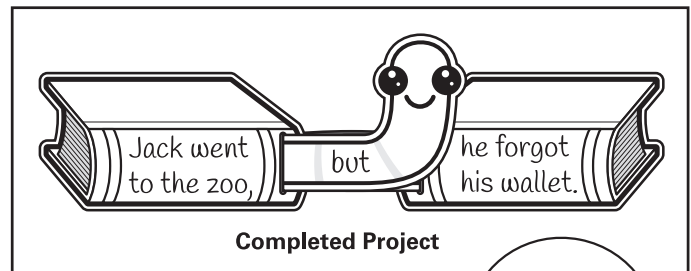
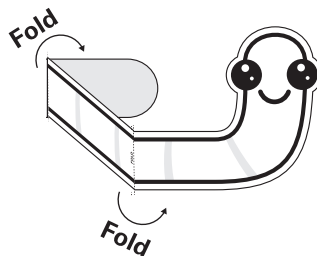
## Step 4:

Complete the sentence on the book labeled "right," using the correct capitalization and punctuation. (The sentence should be written to the right of the slit.) Color or decorate the books and worm.

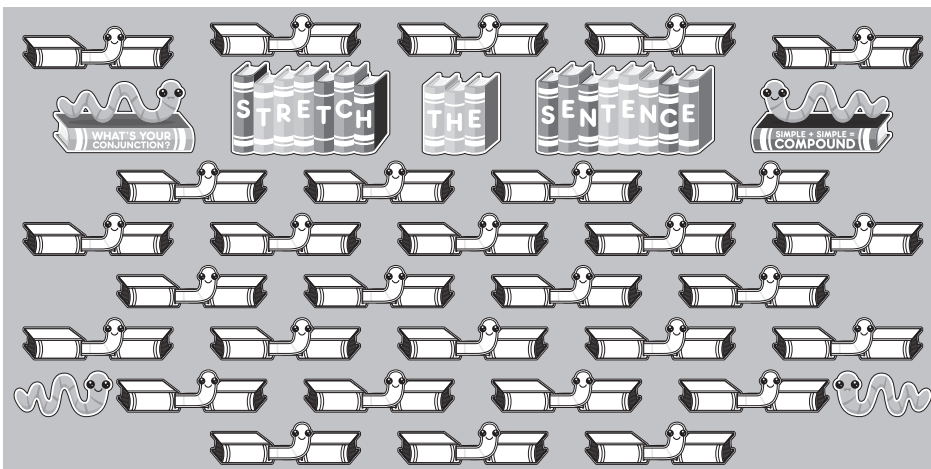


## Step 5:

To assemble, fold the worm at the fold lines as shown below. Insert the worm's tail into the slot on front of the left book, then slip the worm's tail through the right book's slot from beneath. Glue the worm together where indicated to secure.
